

WorkAbility I & Transition Partnership Program

WorkAbility I is a program for special education students ages 14-22. It is designed to promote career awareness and exploration while students complete their secondary education program. WorkAbility I provides students with opportunities for job shadowing, paid and non-paid work experiences, and ongoing support and guidance.

Transition Partnership Program (TPP) is a partnership between the West Contra Costa USD and the State Dept. of Rehabilitation that offers employment assistance and ongoing case management services to our post-secondary students.

Referral Process

Application for Student Services completed by Special Education Teacher / Case Manager

Submit to Employment Specialist assigned to your school for the following types of services:
