





Kindergarten Curriculum


Our kindergarten curriculum is guided by state and national standards

<u>Kindergarten</u> <u>Independence</u>

* As your child enters school, these skills and activities will prepare them to participate productively in a classroom.

Ways to Practice Independence At-Home

At school we work on being independent students. Here are some ways to be independent at home.

- make bed
- □ help set the table
- ☐ clean up toys
- □ help wash/dry dishes
- sweep floors
- put away laundry
- □ help take care of pets
- pack lunch or snack
- pack backpack
- empty backpack after school
- ☐ follow multi-step directions (brush teeth, then get dressed)
- ☐ use polite and respectful language
- use words to express feelings
- eat regular and healthy meals
- put on and fasten shoes
- put jacket on
- open containers
- use table manners
- □ clean up after myself
- practice reading skills
- □ practice math skills
- □ ask questions in complete sentences

Kindergarten School Readiness

Continued

- Taking responsibility for your own actions (ex: if you spill something, you clean it up).
- Establish routines—Schedules are part of life at school and at home. Planning regular daily activities such as snack time or bedtime will help your child get used to routines.

Preparing Your Kindergartener

While your child is at home prior to starting Kindergarten, you can work on these skills:

- Proper pencil grip
- Practice with scissors
- Practice using glue sticks
- Writing name correctly
- Counting to 20 & recognizing numbers 1-10
- Recognizing his/her own name
- Listen to stories, look at books
- Practice recognizing letters, sound, and numbers
- Having conversations

Preparing Your Kindergartener

Do not worry if they cannot read or write:

- Have them practice drawing a straight line vertically (like the base of a capital letter "T")
 - 0
 - Have them practice a slanted or diagonal line (like the side of a capital letter "A")
 - o / or \
 - Have them practice a curve line (like a letter "C")

What do I send with my child to school?

Extra clothes on first day

- Snacks healthy & small
 - (remember no peanuts)

 Backpack/bag - so we can put things in to take home to you

Getting Ready for Kindergarten Before the First Day

Keep a positive attitude.


If you look forward to the first day of school, your child will probably do the same. If you are having concerns, let the teacher know about them.

Getting Ready for Kindergarten Starting the First Day

Leave cheerfully.

Try not to linger. Your presence may distract from this new and exciting world. If you believe your child will have difficulty separating, or you are concerned about how your child is doing, feel free to speak to the teacher (when class is not in session).




Make sure we have your correct phone numbers and emails to ensure you get timely information.

Pick Up: 1:25 p.m. daily





Parking is limited


- Angled parking is reserved for teachers and staff. Please do not park here.
